A Hunt Seat Under Saddle class will be held at each show, and entry fees collected will be donated to an identified charity. If numbers warrant, classes will be divided according to youth and adult entries. Dust off those english saddles and jods, have some fun, and support a worthy cause!!

Again this year, the Island Reining Horse Association will be awarding prize money for 1st (\$ 30) and 2nd (\$ 25) place, in three reining classes, Open, Novice and Rookie.

This prize money will be available at three WHA Shows: **August 28th (Livingstone's), September 18th (Crapaud), and September 19th (Crapaud).**

The NRHA Patterns # 5 or # 11 will be used. Copies of each pattern are included in the Show Book.

The Island Reining Horse Association and the Western Horse Association of PEI are excited about this partnership as an opportunity to encourage riders to try the sport of reining, and encourage all members to give it a try.

General Rules and Regulations

This is just a reminder of **some** of the WHA Rules and Regulations. **For a complete list of rules and regulations please refer to the WHA web site:**

If you would like a hard copy of the rules, please contact a board member and a copy will be mailed to you. Rules and Patterns will also be available at WHA shows. All competitors shall be responsible for the knowledge of WHA rules and AQHA class specifications.

1. There will be no lunging in the show ring after 8:00 AM, or at such time that numbers or safety dictate. The announcer will announce when it is time for exhibitors that are lunging to leave the ring.
2. While in the show ring all riders will pass left to left.
3. Stall fees are paid to the individual facilities and should be booked through them accordingly. Do not send stall fees with your entry.
4. We would like to ask that all exhibitors that are renting stalls at the show facilities clean their stall and area before leaving.
5. It is encouraged, but not necessary, to be a member of the Western Horse Association of PEI to show at WHA shows.
6. If you show as a non-member, your points will only start to be recorded from the date of membership.
7. Highpoint awards for the day are calculated as a total of points received in all classes of the respective divisions for that day. Please note that there may not be High Point Awards presented at all shows.
8. The Speed Division will be placed as follows: Youth (18 years old & under as of Jan 1st of the current year) and Adult (19 years old & over as of Jan 1st of the current year). All riders will run at the same time, but pointed as per the appropriate category.
9. The classes included in the divisions are as follows:
 - Novice Youth:** Showmanship, Horsemanship, Pleasure, Trail
 - Adult:** Showmanship, Horsemanship, Pleasure, Trail
 - Junior Horse:** Horsemanship, Pleasure, Trail
 - Youth:** Showmanship, Horsemanship, Pleasure, Trail
 - Novice Jr. Rider:** Showmanship, Horsemanship, Pleasure, Trail
 - Novice Sr. Rider:** Showmanship, Horsemanship, Pleasure, Trail
 - Youth Speed:** Poles, Barrels, and Down & Back
 - Adult Speed:** Poles, Barrels, and Down & Back
 - Open :** Showmanship, Horsemanship, Pleasure, Trail

All other classes are pointed separately.

10. Classes may be entered individually, if the full division classes are not desired.
11. A \$15.00 horse fee will be charged for horses not entered in competition but using show facilities. We ask that you register at the secretary's booth.
12. Insurance is Mandatory. No one may show without proof of insurance. This must be paid through Island Horse Council and is only \$25.00 for the entire year for any individual. Temporary insurance can be purchase at a cost of \$15.00 a day or \$7.50 for children entering a Lead Line or Walk/Trot class only. Out of Province Competitors must show proof of liability insurance from their own provincial board or purchase temporary insurance at this show.
13. All money must accompany the entry forms. If no money is received with the form. Please refer to the individual show forms for the applicable Post Entry Fee.
14. No entries will be taken over the phone or through email.
15. Any open class may be a stake class and a stake fee may be charged. However, any exhibitor may enter the class but only those paying the stake fee are eligible for prize money.
16. All horses must walk in and out of the ring. The gate will be closed after all entries are in the ring, and will remain until the end of the class/individual run.
17. During a WHA sanctioned event or show, any exhibitor may be disqualified (for the entire show) by any WHA official acting under the Judges authority if the said exhibitor does abuse a horse, the Judge or any WHA official
18. In the Novice Divisions no more than (8) eight horses will be asked to lope on the rail at once.
19. All Youth Riders competing in the **Speed Events**, must wear **CSA** approved headgear in competition and on show premises at all times when mounted.

Divisions for Competition

Adult Division is open to all riders 19 yrs of age or over, as of Jan. 1st of the current year. Classes include: Showmanship – Horsemanship – Pleasure - Trail

Youth Division is open to all riders 18 yrs of age or under, as of Jan. 1st of the current year. **Stallions may not be shown by a youth.** Classes include: Showmanship – Horsemanship – Pleasure - Trail.

Novice Youth Division is open to Novice Youth, 18 yrs of age and under, as of Jan. 1st of the current year, who are not competing in any other classes in the show, (except as noted in **Bold** below). Entries will be required to walk, jog and may be required to lope individually, at the Judges discretion. Two hands on the reins will be permitted. Classes include: Showmanship, Horsemanship, Pleasure and Trail. **A Novice Youth will be allowed to compete in the Novice Junior Rider Division in two shows, without forfeiting their Novice Youth status. A Novice Youth will be allowed to enter Open Halter without jeopardizing their Novice Youth Status.**

Open Horse Division is open to all horses and riders unless restricted by rules of another division they are showing. ie: Novice youth. Classes include Showmanship- Horsemanship - Pleasure - Trail.

Junior Horse Division is open to all horses 5 years of age or under. A Junior Horse may also be shown in other divisions in a snaffle or bosal using two hands on the reins. 3 to 5 year olds may be ridden one handed in a shank bit. Classes include: Horsemanship – Pleasure – Trail.

Junior Horse Walk/Jog is open to all horses 5 years or age or under as of January 1st of that show year. Horses entered in this class cannot enter any other riding class for that show.

Novice Junior Rider Division (18 years of age and under as of Jan 1st of the current year) & Novice Senior Rider Division (19 years of age and over as of Jan 1st of the current year) is open to all riders who have not earned (50) fifty points or more in the WHA Novice Divisions. Once 50 points or more have been reached, they will no longer be eligible for either of these Novice Divisions in subsequent years. The purpose of these Divisions is to encourage inexperienced riders to gain competitive show experience. A Novice rider may use two hands on the reins in these Divisions. **Stallions may not be exhibited in the Novice Divisions.** No more than (8) eight entries will be asked to lope on the rail at once. Classes include: Showmanship – Horsemanship, Pleasure and Trail.

Speed Event Divisions:

Adult Speed is open to any adult 19 yrs of age or over as of Jan 1st of the current year. Classes include: Barrels, Poles, and Down & Back.

Youth Speed is open to any Youth 18 yrs of age or under as of Jan 1st of the current year. Classes include: Barrels, Poles, and Down & Back. All youth in the speed divisions must wear **CSA** approved headgear while participating in the speed divisions.

***All Youth and Adult entries in the Speed Classes will be run at the same time. But will be pointed and awarded separately.

Open Classes (These are not included in a Division, but are pointed as single classes) Open to all competitors. Classes include: Western Working Horse, Western Riding, Reining and Command.

Special Classes Include: Child's walk/jog – Child's Lead line. **Note:** Children may enter either Child's walk/jog or Child's Lead line, **but not both.** These classes are open to competitors 10 years of age or under as of Jan. 1st of the current year who is not competing in any other class in the show. Entries will be required to walk and jog only. Two hands on the reins will be permitted.

Only those eligible for the Novice Divisions may enter Novice Trail.

Additional classes may be added at the show committees discretion, i.e. Now and Thenners, Island Bred, Rookie Pleasure, etc.

WHA Points System

All WHA shows will be pointed with the exception of training or fun show. At the end of the show season in case of a tie, the competitor who has attended the most shows will get preference.

Note Each entry is composed of one horse/rider combination and must have a separate show number, purchased from the show committee. A rider with more than one horse must have a separate number for each horse/rider combination and a horse with more than one rider must also have a separate number for each horse/rider combination. All points earned will count for that horse/rider combination only. All WHA sanctioned shows will count for year-end awards. Only WHA members in good standing will be eligible for year-end awards. The points system works as follows: if a class has 6 or more entries in it, 6 placings will be awarded, 1st place receiving 6 points, 2nd 5 points and so on, 6th place will be awarded 1 point.

In the event that a class has less than 6 entries in it, the points will be awarded based on the number in the class, for example, if a class has 4 entries in it then the 1st place will receive 4 points, 2nd place 3 points, 3rd place 2 points and 4th place will receive 1 point.

The size of the class includes all entries that compete in the class regardless of disqualifications.

In the event of a tie in total points, the competitor with the most 1st place winnings will place highest. If there is still a tie, the most 2nd place winnings will be counted, and so on until the tie is broken. If a tie still exists, the tied contestant who placed over the largest number of entries would then win.

All accounts for WHA shows must be paid in full. This will include post entry fees and NSF Cheques. Competitors will have (10) ten days, after notification, to rectify any outstanding accounts or points will not be awarded.

Western Horse Association Provincial Heritage Championships

The WHA will be offering yearly Provincial Championship awards to members participating in the WHA Heritage Circuit Shows. These will be awarded on the total points accumulated during the show year in each division, as well as the individual pointed classes. To be eligible for year end awards, you must be a member of the WHA, and must enter and exhibit that class or division in at least 5 of the 7 pointed shows offered in 2010. **Please note: The training show is not a pointed show.**

Rules and Regulations for all Events

1. All the exhibitors must be members in good standing with the WHA to be eligible for high point or year-end awards. No points will be earned until a membership is purchased.
2. **While a membership is not necessary to exhibit in WHA shows, it is encouraged that exhibitors purchase a membership.**

3. All entries shall be responsible for the knowledge of WHA rules and AQHA class specifications.
4. All competitors must be insured through Island Horse Council insurance program.
5. It is the responsibility of each competitor to ensure that they enter only classes, which they are eligible for.
6. In the event of a tie, the next placing will not be awarded. For example, if there is a tie for second place, there will not be a third place awarded. The prize money for the tied placings will be added with the next placing and split. Full points will be awarded to both. All ties for first place must be broken.
7. If a rider had two horses in one event, that rider will be allowed a spacing of at least five (5) horses between his/her two mounts, if numbers allow.
8. All horses entered in a class must be assembled in ample time to allow the class to continue without delay. A contestant will have thirty (30) seconds to make his/her way to the ring after their number is called. Failure to do so will result in elimination. The decision of the person calling the numbers is final.
9. Riders must make a point of being dressed neatly and cleanly. Appropriate western attire is required which includes pants (slacks, trousers, jeans, etc) western hat or helmet and boots. The hat or helmet must be on the rider's head when the exhibitor enters the arena. Spurs and chaps are optional. Should proper dress not be adhered to, the Judge may have due cause to disqualify the rider.
10. Horses will be shown with proper western saddle and bridle, saddle pad is mandatory. Silver is optional and will not be given preference over a good working outfit. Equipment must be neat and well kept. Any humane bit is allowed, however, the Judge may prohibit the use of bits or equipment he/she may consider severe or unsafe. Chain and leather curb straps must be a least 1/2-inch in width and be loose enough to allow two fingers between the horses jaw and the strap. The use of a rawhide braided, leather braided or rope bosal is also allowed on the Junior horse. The "mechanical hackamore" can only be used in the speed event classes. Protective boots, leg wraps and bandages are permitted in reining, western riding, western horsemanship, command and speed classes only.
11. It is strictly forbidden to spur, whip or hit a horse forward of the girth line.
12. A stallion may not be shown or handled by a youth in any class or on show grounds. Stallions are not eligible to compete in the Novice divisions.
13. No contestant may address the Judge without the approval of the ring steward.
14. If a class has only one entry, that class will take place unless the competitor wishes to withdraw from the class. If the competitor wishes, they may ride in the corresponding class in the opposite age division but will still be judged, placed and pointed separately ie. A Novice Junior Rider with no competition may ride in the Novice Senior Rider Division for that class, but will still be placed and pointed as a Novice Junior (1st place).

Class Specifications

All WHA Heritage Circuit shows will follow the class specifications of the American Quarter Horse Association. Please refer to the AQHA rule book for full details. A summary only, of the class specifications is as follows:

Showmanship

This class must be judged on the contestant's ability to fit and show a horse in a halter class. The confirmation of the horse must not count to accumulate points. Entries will be judged on: **1** Condition and thriftiness of the horse. **2** Grooming and hoof care.

3 Trimming. **4** Tack, Halter and lead must be leather. **5** Appearance and attitude of exhibitor. **6** Ability to show horse in the ring. **7** Posing, poise, alertness and merits.

Horsemanship

The object of this class is to demonstrate the horsemanship qualities of a rider. Riders are judged on seat, hands and their ability to control and show a horse. Results as shown by performance of the horse are not to be considered more important than the method used by the rider in obtaining them. Each rider is to work individually. Individual work may be comprised of any maneuvers the Judge feels are necessary to determine the horsemanship ability of the rider. Patterns to be posted at least one hour before the class. Any or all exhibitors may be called back for rail work.

Western Pleasure

This class will be judged on the performance, good manners, disposition, condition and confirmation of the horse. Horses must work at a walk, jog and lope on a reasonably loose rein without undue restraint. Horses must work both ways of the ring at all three gaits to demonstrate their ability with different leads. At the option of the judge, horses may be asked to extend the walk, jog and lope, one or both ways of the ring. Never more than twelve (12) horses may be asked to extend at the lope at one time. Horses are to be reversed to the inside (away from the rail). They may be required to reverse at the walk or jog at the discretion of the Judge, but shall not be asked to reverse at the lope. The rider shall not be required to dismount except in the event the Judge wishes to check equipment.

Command Class

This class is an elimination one that may look like a pleasure class, many horsemanship commands may be asked for during the class, stop, backing up, counter canter, posting trot on proper diagonal, etc. The judge eliminates those not following commands or taking too much time to obey commands. The judge calls the faulty exhibitors in the middle of the ring to line up.

Trail

Western Riding

Western riding is an event where the horse is judged on quality of gaits, lead changes at the lope, and response to the rider, manners and disposition. The horse should perform with reasonable speed, and be sensible, well-mannered, free and easy moving. Horses may be ridden with light contact or on a reasonable loose rein. The pattern must be posted at least one hour before the scheduled time of the class. Markers should be separated by a uniform distance of not less than 30 feet no more than 50 feet. Any entry not following the exact pattern or refusing an obstacle (e.g. the pole) is disqualified.

Reining

Each contestant will perform the required reining pattern individually and separately. To rein a horse is not only to guide him, but also to control his every movement. The best-reined horse should be willfully guided or controlled with little or no apparent resistance and dictated to completely. Any movement on his own must be considered a lack of control. All deviations from the exact written pattern must be considered a lack or temporary loss of control and therefore faulted according to severity of deviation. Credit will be given for smoothness, finesse, attitude, quickness and authority in performing the various maneuvers while using controlled speed. The pattern must be posted at least one hour before the scheduled time of class. The judge will pick a pattern from the set of patterns as determined by AQHA.

Western Working Horse

This class will be judged on the horse's suitability to carry its rider through a prescribed pattern of working maneuvers. Horse must demonstrate athletic ability, calmness and readiness to respond to the rider. Horses will be worked individually and must adhere to the correct pattern. Horse will demonstrate all gaits, lead changes, two tracking, rein back, turns on the haunches or forehand and side passing. The pattern must be posted at least one hour before the scheduled time of the class.

Speed Events

1. Western type of equipment must be used. Use of a hackamore or other types of bridles is the optional choice of the contestant. However, the judge may prohibit the use of bits or equipment that he/she may consider severe. A contestant has the optional use of a tie down, martingale or draw reins. Two hands may be used on the reins.
2. Any contestant crossing the start line without a hat on his/her head will be disqualified. If the judge feels that a contestant deliberately flips his/her hat off after crossing the start line, they will be disqualified, or if a contestant loses their hat, they will first receive a verbal warning, the second time losing a hat, and thereafter, they will be disqualified from that run. It should be noted the first warning stands for the entire show. Hat chinstraps are permitted.
3. Riders under eighteen (18) years of age must wear CSA approved headgear in competition and on show premises at all times when mounted.
4. All horses entering in a class must be assembled in ample time for runs to start on time and continue without delay. They must remain in readiness in case of a tie. A contestant will have 30 seconds to make their way to the ring after their number is called, failure to do so will result in elimination. The decision of the person calling the numbers is final.
5. Riders are to be given the signal to enter the ring. Upon entering the ring there will be no further signal. The run will not start until the horse is in the ring, unless chute is provided and the show committee designates that it is safe.
6. An electric timer or two stop watches (digital if possible) must be used at all times. This is the responsibility of the show committee. Horses are to be timed on the nose.
7. Starting line markers and electronic times must be set a good distance apart in the arena, at least as far apart as the first two barrels.

8. Should the timing equipment be found not to be working, then that horse shall be given a re-run after all the horses have run, provided the horse does not go off course.
9. A horse and rider will not be re-run if broken equipment occurs after crossing the start/finish line. If equipment breakage occurs before the start/finish line the contestant shall be placed at the bottom of the running order or allowed 5 mins to repair the equipment.
10. Knock downs will result in a five (5) second penalty for each knock down. Barrels or poles that fall after the finish line has been crossed won't be counted. If during the course of an event, a pole or barrel is hit by horse or rider in such a way that it hits the ground and rights itself, that contestant will be assessed a five (5) second penalty for a knock down.
11. In the event of a tie for first place only, a run-off must be held. Ties for other placings will be left as is. However for example, if there occurs a tie for second place there will be no third place award. The prize money for the tied place will be added with the next placing and split.
12. A reasonable use of a bat and/or spurs is acceptable only behind the front cinch. If the use of bat and/or spurs is not reasonable the judge may first warn the contestant of the abuse. If the abuse is repeated, then the contestant will be disqualified from the entire show. When the contestant bats his/her horse while going to the finish line and knowing very well that the pattern is incorrect the judge may disqualify him/her from the entire show.
13. In the event he/she drops a piece of clothing or equipment the contestant will not remain in the ring after his/her pattern is completed. One of the officials will return the dropped article to the warm up ring. This procedure will eliminate undue loss of time.
14. In the event of a tie, if the first contestant is disqualified in the run-off, the horse declared the winner in the run-off must re-run the pattern within two (2) seconds of the original time or the run off must be held again.
15. A minimum distance (or as close as possible to) of 50 feet must be made available between the finish line and the end of the arena to give horses a reasonable stopping distance. Any situation where the distance can be increased should be taken advantage of for the benefit of the horse.
16. When setting up pattern it is advised: -in barrel racing the first and second barrel must have at least a 15 foot space from the fence, and the third barrel at least a 20 foot space from the fence. In pole bending, to begin setting the pattern at the far end of the arena (opposite the finish line) the first pole must be 21 feet from the fence. The remaining poles must be 21 feet apart (center of pole to center of pole) with a 21-foot space from the top pole to the finish line.
17. When the running order is drawn, horses will run in the order drawn except when one rider has two mounts. That rider will be allowed a spacing of at least 5 horses between his two animals, if possible.
18. Speed Event Divisions will include classes for both Youth (18 years of age and under as of Jan 1st of current year) and Adult (19 years of age and over as of Jan 1st of current year). Classes include: Poles, Barrels, and Down & Back.

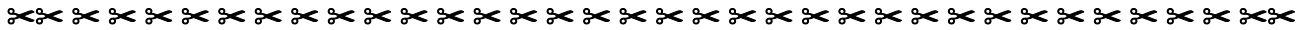

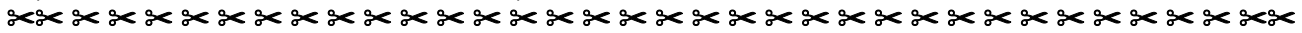

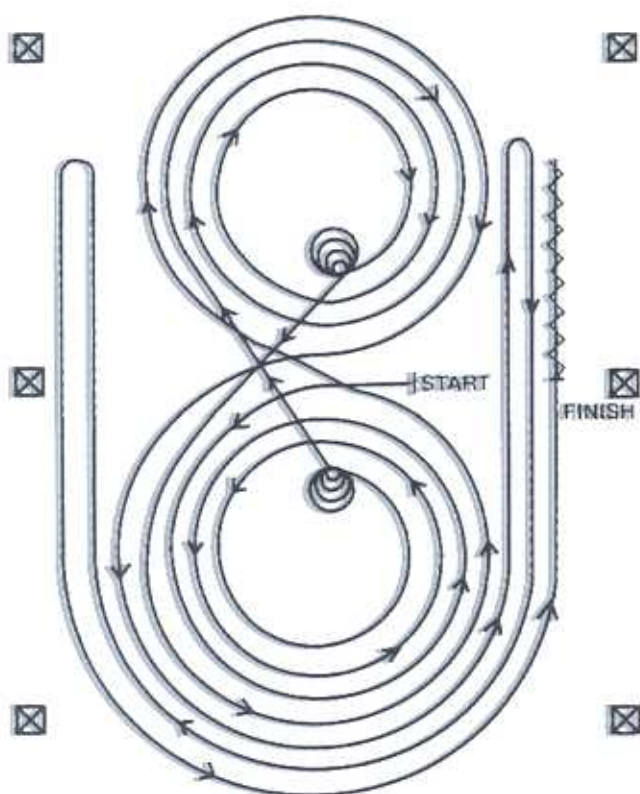
PATTERN

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Horses may walk or trot to the center of arena. Horses must walk or stop prior to starting pattern. Beginning at the center of the arena facing the left wall or fence.

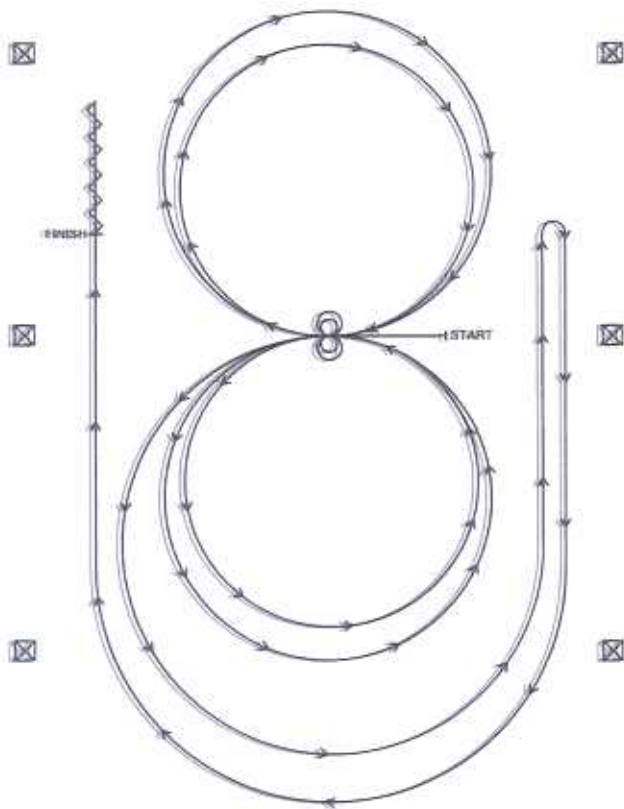
1. Beginning on the left lead, complete three circles to the left: the first two circles large and fast; the third circle small and slow. Stop at the center of the arena. Hesitate.
2. Complete four spins to the left. Hesitate.
3. Beginning on the right lead, complete three circles to the right: the first two circles large and fast; the third circle small and slow. Stop at the center of the arena. Hesitate.
4. Complete four spins to the right. Hesitate.
5. Beginning on the left lead, run a large fast circle to the left, change leads at the center of the arena, run a large fast circle to the right, and change leads at the center of the arena. (Figure 8)
6. Continue around previous circle to the left but do not close this circle. Run up the right side of the arena past the center marker and do a right rollback at least twenty feet (six meters) from the wall or fence – no hesitation.
7. Continue around previous circle but do not close this circle. Run up the left side of the arena past the center marker and do a left rollback at least twenty feet (six meters) from the wall or fence – no hesitation.
8. Continue back around previous circle but do not close this circle. Run up the right side of the arena past the center marker and do a sliding stop at least twenty feet (six meters) from the wall or fence. Back up at least ten feet (three meters). Hesitate to demonstrate completion of the pattern.

Rider must dismount and drop bridle to the designated judge.

Horses may walk or trot to the center of the arena. Horses must walk or stop prior to starting the pattern. Beginning at the center of the arena facing the left wall or fence.

1. Beginning on the left lead, complete two circles to the left. Stop at the center of the arena. Hesitate.
2. Complete two spins to the left. Hesitate.
3. Beginning on the right lead complete two circles to the right. Stop at the center of the arena. Hesitate.
4. Complete two spins to the right. Hesitate.
5. Beginning on the left lead, go around the end of the arena, run down the right side of the arena past center marker, stop and roll back right.
6. Continue around the end of the arena to run down the left side of the arena past the center marker. Stop. Back up.

Rider must dismount and drop the bridle to the designated judge.
